Sayın Üyemiz,

T.C. Ticaret Bakanlığı İthalat Genel Müdürlüğünden alınan bir yazıda, Kanada tarafından 11 Ağustos 2025 tarihinden bu yana ülkemiz menşeli **“Petrol Boruları” (Oil country tubular goods-OCTG)** ithalatına karşı bir firmamız özelinde bir anti-damping soruşturması yürütülmekte olduğu hatırlatılmaktadır.

Bu çerçevede, Ottawa Ticaret Müşavirliğimizden alınan bir yazıya atıfla; Kanada Sınır Hizmetleri Kurumu’ndan (CBSA) alınan ekli bildirim ile, CBSA tarafından yürütülen soruşturma kapsamında Ön Karar’ın açıklandığı; bu çerçevede 22 Aralık 2025 tarihinden itibaren geçerli olmak üzere mezkur firmamız için %12,1 oranında geçici önlem alındığı, buna ilişkin Gerekçeli Karar’ın ise 15 gün içerisinde yayımlanacağı belirtilmektedir.

Bununla birlikte CBSA yetkililerinin 19-22 Ocak 2026 tarihleri arasında soruşturma konusu firmada yerinde doğrulama ziyareti gerçekleştirmeyi planlandığı belirtilmektedir.

Dear Halil İbrahim Karataş:

This refers to the notice dated August 11, 2025, informing you that, pursuant to subsection 31(1) of the *Special Import Measures Act* (SIMA), investigations have been initiated respecting the alleged injurious dumping of oil country tubular goods (OCTG) originating in or exported from the United Mexican States and the Republic of the Philippines, and originating in the Republic of Türkiye and exported or produced by, or on behalf of, Borusan Mannesmann Boru Sanayi ve Ticaret A.Ş., originating in the Republic of Korea and exported or produced by, or on behalf of, Hyundai Steel Company, and originating in the United States of America and exported or produced by, or on behalf of, Tenaris S.A. (collectively, “the subject countries and exporters/producers”).

The preliminary phase of the investigation is now complete. The evidence available to the CBSA indicates that OCTG from the subject countries and exporters/producers has been dumped. Therefore, on December 22, 2025, the Canada Border Services Agency (CBSA) made a preliminary determination of dumping respecting OCTG from the subject countries and exporters/producers pursuant to subsection 38(1) of the SIMA.

A *Statement of Reasons*, which summarizes the information on which these decisions were based and which describes, in general terms, the future activities related to the investigations, will be available within 15 days on the CBSA’s website at www.cbsa-asfc.gc.ca/sima.

The investigation is continuing and the CBSA must make a final determination of dumping or terminate the investigation by March 23, 2026. The investigation schedule can be viewed on the CBSA’s website.

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On October 9, 2025, the Canadian International Trade Tribunal (CITT) determined that there is evidence that discloses a reasonable indication that the dumping of the subject goods has caused injury to the domestic industry. The CITT is now conducting an inquiry into the question of injury and is expected to issue its final decision by April 21, 2026.

Pursuant to subsection 8(1) of SIMA, provisional duties are payable on the subject goods that are released from the CBSA during the period commencing December 22, 2025, and ending on the earlier of the day the investigation is terminated, the day on which the CITT makes an order or finding, or the day an undertaking is accepted. During this period, referred to as the provisional period, the importer of such goods shall pay, or cause to be paid, provisional duties or post security in the prescribed form.

The amount of provisional duties payable on imported goods will be equal to the estimated margin of dumping. The various rates of provisional duties are indicated in the **Attachment 1** of this letter.

It should also be noted that it will be necessary for officers of the CBSA to visit exporters to verify information provided during this investigation. In this respect, I am writing to inform you that CBSA officers have scheduled verification visits at the premises of one exporter in Türkiye in January 2026, as detailed in **Attachment 2**. The purpose of these visits is to obtain clarification and to verify information received in connection with the investigation.
