Sayın Üyemiz,

T.C. Ticaret Bakanlığı İthalat Genel Müdürlüğünden alınan bir yazıda; Birleşik Krallık (BK) tarafından Çin Halk Cumhuriyeti (ÇHC), menşeli “Seraamik Sofra ve Mutfak Eşyaları” (Birleşik Krallık Küresel Gümrük Tarifesi (UKGT) altında 6911.10.00.90, 6912.00.21.91, 6912.00.25.10, 6912.00.21.11, 6912.00.23.10 ve 6912.00.29.10 sınıflandırılan) ithalatına karşı tatbik edilmekte olan nihai anti-damping önlemine ilişkin olarak bir ara gözden geçirme soruşturması (*interimreview*) başlatılmış olduğu ve konuya ilişkin 20 Temmuz 2026 tarihinde yayımlanan nüshasına <https://public-file.trade-remedies.service.gov.uk/case/ir0093/submission/1036> bağlantısı üzerinden ulaşılabilceğı bildirilmektedir.

Yazıda devamla; Trade Remedies Authority (TRA)'dan alınan ve Ek'te yer alan yazıda, halihazırda devam etmekte olan bahse konu soruşturma çerçevesinde, ÇHC menşeli ilgili sektörde özel piyasa koşulları olabileceğı iddiasından hareketle “normal değer” ve damping marjı hesaplamalarında Türkiye'nin “emsal ülke” (*analogue country*) olarak değerlendirilebileceğı ifade edilmektedir.

Söz konusu yazıda, mezkûr soruşturma konusu ürüne ilişkin Türkiye'de üretim ve satışın olup olmadığına ilişkin malumat; eğer varsa bunları gerçekleştiren firmalar ile üretici birliklerinin isim ve iletişim bilgileri talep edilmektedir.

Interim review concerning Ceramic Tableware and Kitchenware originating in the People's Republic of China: IR0093

Intention to choose Türkiye as a suitable representative country and to invite participation from producers of Ceramic Tableware and Kitchenware from Türkiye

Dear Mr. Atilla Uğur Başbuğ,

The Trade Remedies Authority (TRA) is responsible for investigating allegations of unfair international trade practices which may affect UK industries.

On 20 July 2026, the TRA published a [Notice of Initiation](#) (NOI) that clarified this review concerns measures on Ceramic Tableware and Kitchenware originating in the People's Republic of China (PRC), imposed in the Secretary of State's notice no. [2025/21](#).

The review will consider whether the continued application of the current anti-dumping amounts are necessary or sufficient to offset the dumping of the goods, **or prevent the injury caused by dumped goods previously established**, whether the circumstances in respect of the dumped goods have changed significantly, and whether – and if so to what level – it is appropriate to vary the anti-dumping amount.

Certain ceramic tableware and kitchenware originating from the PRC and exported to the UK, are described as:

Ceramic tableware and kitchenware, excluding ceramic condiment or spice mills and their ceramic grinding parts, ceramic coffee mills, ceramic knife sharpeners, ceramic sharpeners, ceramic kitchen tools to be used for cutting, grinding, grating, slicing, scraping and peeling, and cordierite ceramic pizza-stones of a kind used for baking pizza or bread.

The goods subject to review are subject to the following UK Global Tariff (UKGT) commodity codes (provided for information):

• 69 11 10 00 90

• 69 12 00 21 91

• 69 12 00 25 10

The TRA's previous transition review on Ceramic Tableware and Kitchenware from the PRC identified the likely existence of a Particular Market Situation (PMS) in the Ceramic Tableware and Kitchenware market in the PRC.

The TRA is now investigating whether a PMS exists in the market for Ceramic Tableware and Kitchenware in the PRC.

The TRA is yet to make a formal PMS determination in this review. However, should a PMS exist this may have an effect on the domestic sales price. If this effect prevents a proper comparison with the export price, we would not use that price to determine normal value.

In such circumstances, the TRA may determine the normal value by determining the costs of production plus a reasonable amount for administrative, selling, and general costs and for profits. Adjustments may then be made to these figures using data from an appropriate, representative third country (also referred to as "analogue country").

The TRA is proposing to choose Türkiye as an appropriate representative third country in this investigation, should it be required. The TRA proposes to publish a note to the file outlining our proposal to choose Türkiye as a suitable representative third country on **16 September 2026** and will give interested parties seven calendar days (until **23 September 2026**) to comment on this proposal. After that date, we are intending to make a final decision on the appropriate representative country, and we will publish a note to the file explaining this decision.

Should we choose Türkiye as the analogue country, we intend to invite producers in Türkiye to participate in the investigation by registering to our cases using the [Trade Remedies Service](#) (TRS) platform once the registration period is open and invite producers to complete a registration form. If multiple producers choose to participate, we may use an appropriate sampling methodology to select who to involve further. If selected as a sampled producer, we will invite them to complete a further questionnaire with more information.

We will then ask the Turkish producers to complete a questionnaire and provide certain sales and cost data, including commercially sensitive information. We will treat this information as confidential and will also ask them to provide a non-confidential version or summary of the information, so that we can publish this on our [public file](#).

If Türkiye is identified as a suitable analogue country, we would welcome any suggestions of Ceramic Tableware and Kitchenware producers you would recommend us contacting.
